

Developing Successful Small Farm Enterprises Workshop

A two-day course on Developing Successful Small Farm Enterprises will be offered by University of Tennessee Extension and Tennessee State University Cooperative Extension.

This program is directed toward owners and potential owners of small acreages who desire information on how to best utilize their land and other resources.

Workshop topics will address issues such as marketing, high tunnel production, soil fertility and suitability, irrigation, USDA programs, small flock poultry, regulations, vegetable production and small fruit production. 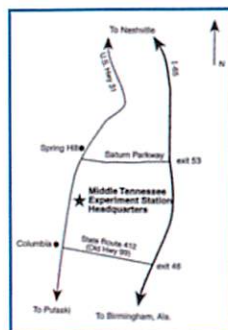
I-65 South from Nashville

Exit 53 - Saturn Parkway. Go west (Parkway goes west only) approximately 3 – 4 miles. At split, take "Highway 31 South Columbia" ramp. Ramp loops down onto Highway 31 heading south. Travel approximately 1 mile to MTREC entrance. (GM Plant will be on the right and MTREC entrance will be on the left).

I-65 North from Alabama

Exit 46 – Columbia/Chapel Hill. Go west on State Route 412 approximately 5 – 6 miles to Highway 31 (2nd traffic light). Go north on Highway 31 approximately 6 miles to MTREC entrance. (GM Plant will be on the left and MTREC entrance will be on the right).

Follow paved road past office and dairy barn. Turn right toward bull test station.
